

# S. L. Will See Premiere of Gold Boom Town Film, 'Parson of Panamint,' Next Week

Another motion picture premiere for Salt Lake City was in the offing Wednesday, Mayor Ab Jenkins said following a long-distance telephone conversation with Harry Sherman, Hollywood producer.

The film, "The Parson of Panamint," will have its initial showing at the Utah theater July 10. Cast members and the film author,

Peter B. Kyne, are expected to attend, Mayor Jenkins said.

Starred in the picture is Charles Ruggles, who plays the part of Chuckawalla Bill, bewhiskered mayor of the gold boom town of Panamint, Cal. Philip Terry plays the two-fisted cleric who takes brotherly love to the brawling community.

Others in the cast are Ellen

Drew, Joseph Schildkraut, Porter Hall, Henry Kolker and Janet Beecher. Date of their arrival in the city will be announced by Charles M. Pincus, Utah theater manager.

Last August the world premiere of "Brigham Young" was held in Salt Lake City.

Mr. Sherman is widely known in southern Utah, where he has screened many of his productions, including the Hopalong Cassidy series.

Mayor Jenkins suggested that Mr. Sherman bring William Boyd, noted western player, to Salt Lake City for the event.
