

Smoky Arrives For Parade At Last Minute

While the stars and starlets who will appear at the Utah theater premiere of "Smoky" Wednesday at 7:15 p. m. all arrived on schedule Tuesday noon at the Salt Lake airport, Smoky himself, the dashing black horse who is THE star, barely eased under the wire for his parade date in downtown Salt Lake at 2 p. m.

Smoky dismounted from his special United Air Lines plane at 1:25 p. m. and was hustled into the city with much haste just in time to lead the parade.
