Has Double Bill

The Broadway theater, formerly the Isis, is currently presenting as its chief screen attraction the comedy drama, "After Office Hours," which costars Clark Gable and Constance Bennett. A second feature is "Fighting Pioneers," a thrill western.

The name of the Isis was formally changed to the Broadway on Sunday, following the expenditure of a large sum on renovation and remodeling of the theater, including a huge new electric sign.

"After Office Hours" is a lusty piece about New York society, the press and a murder, with Gable cast as a hardboiled managing editor who always gets his story, although sometimes forced to use the methods of the Northwest Mounted police. Miss Bennett is the publisher's socialite niece, who serves as his society reporter. There is comedy, drama and murder mystery in the piece and, of course, plenty of colorful romance. In the excellent supporting cast are Bille Burke, Stuart Erwin, Katharine Alexander, Harvey Stephens, Henry Armetta and many others.

Rex Bell and Ruth Mix are the featured players in the western story which, with its tale of the old west, fits perfectly into the Covered Wagon Days spirit of the moment.
