## 4 Stars Arrive To Attend - Debut of Film

Three cowboys and a lady stepped off a Union Pacific Streamliner Wednesday morning as about 100 Salt Lakers 'oh'd', and 'ah'd' and a four-piece grandmother band strummed cowboy tunes.

Sixshooters and saddles were out of sight, though, as lovely Ann Blyth, together with Howard Duff, Chill Wills and Edgar Buchanan, all stars of the technicolor motion picture, "Red Canyon," arrived for the film's world premiere at the Utah theater Thursday.

Only rootin'-tootin' appearing cowboy was Chill Wills—a 6 foot 8 inch giant who flashed a big grin underneath a ten gallon hat and wore a loud yellow and green tie.
